



Children's Online Privacy Protection Act (COPPA)

The **Children's Online Privacy Protection Act (COPPA)** is a federal law that safeguards the online privacy of children. It requires website and online service operators to obtain verifiable parental consent before collecting personal information from children under 13 years old.

COPPA permits schools to act as agents for parents and provide consent to collect personal information only when it is used for educational purposes.

Saint Philip Neri Catholic School utilizes various online tools and educational applications - such as Clever, Google Workspace for Education, GoGuardian and other Curriculum Department-approved third-party sites - to support and enhance students' learning. These platforms may collect personal information (such as name, grade level, and login data) to:

- Create individual student account
- Track academic progress
- Deliver personalized learning experiences throughout the school year
